Program Highlights

He continues to serve as a CAP inspector for the Laboratory Accreditation Program. Dr. Godbey was sworn in as the CAP’s president in 2019.

Scott Lindquist, MD, MPH is the WA State Epidemiologist for Communicable Diseases and Deputy Health Officer. He completed his medical training at the University of Washington School of Medicine as a student of the WAMI (Washington, Alaska, Montana, and Idaho) program. He completed a residency in pediatrics at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and an Infectious Disease Fellowship at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, Texas. He completed his Masters in Public Health at the Harvard School of Public Health. Dr. Lindquist has drawn upon this broad background to focus upon underserved populations and infectious diseases. He has combined all the aspects of his training as a Health Officer/Director of Health for the Kitsap County Health District from 2001–2014. In addition, he serves as a pediatrician and public health officer at the Port Gamble S’Klallam Tribal Medical Clinic where he has worked one day a week since 2001. Dr. Lindquist has been the Washington State Tuberculosis medical consultant since 2002 and currently serves as the State Epidemiologist for Communicable Diseases and Deputy Health Officer for Washington State.
